

GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

Full-length papers presented at the conference will be considered for publication as a Special Feature in ***Superconductor Science and Technology***. Each paper submitted will be refereed to the usual standards of quality for the journal. Only full-length papers, between 5 and 8 journal pages, will be considered for the special issue. You can assume about 900 words per journal page including an allowance of 300 words per figure or table. Publication date, assuming deadlines are met, is February 2004.

Please note that papers will be set in the usual journal style, and will **NOT be printed from authors' camera-ready copy**.

Guidelines on the preparation and submission of manuscripts are given below. In particular, please note that material already published elsewhere will not be considered.

Submission Guidelines

You are encouraged to submit your article in electronic form so that it can be refereed without postal delays and be published more quickly. Please submit all components necessary to generate a complete printed version of your article together with any other media enhancements.

How to submit:

Please hand in **three (3) hard copies of your paper and an electronic file on disk** with an **Article submission form** and **Assignment of Copyright** form to the publication desk at the conference site. (These forms will be available on the conference web site and at the conference itself. The copyright form is also available online at <http://www.iop.org/journals/authors>.)

You should also send an **electronic file** of your paper by email or on a disk by post directly to IOPP to arrive no later than 11 August 2003. *Authors must not submit a paper to IOPP without giving a hard copy of the paper to the Guest Editors at the conference.*

Emailing your paper to IOPP:

A single compressed file containing an archive of your submission information (*readme.txt*), text and graphics files should be sent, as an attachment where possible, to the journal's e-mail address (**sust@iop.org**) with the words '**IWCC 2003 special issue**' in the subject line. It is extremely important that you use these words in the subject line. Please do not send each of your text and graphics files as separate e-mails as this causes a considerable delay in processing your submission.

MULTIMEDIA SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

All Institute of Physics Publishing journals encourage authors to submit multimedia attachments to enhance the online versions of published research articles. The printed journal remains the archival version and multimedia items are supplements, which *enhance* a reader's understanding of the paper but are not *essential* to that understanding.

Video clips and animation

Acceptable formats for video or animation clips are MPEG (we recommend MPEG1), QuickTime (we recommend Cinepak codec for compression, and Quality 100%), Windows AVI or Animated GIF (use only standard GIF functions as some browsers do not support the whole GIF standard).

Your video or animation clips are intended for internet use via our Web server, and we need to consider the needs of users with slow internet connections (e.g. modem-based users) so that your work can be made available to the widest possible readership. Please aim to minimize file sizes and data rates by considering the following points.

- 480 x 360 pixels (width by height) is the recommended maximum frame size.
- A recommended frame speed is 12-15 frames per second (fps). (Many packages output 30fps as standard, but it is possible to specify lower frame speeds).
- Use a 256 colour palette if that is suitable for the presentation of the material.

Please consider the use of lower specifications for all these points if the material can still be represented clearly. Our recommended maximum file size is 3MB. Our recommended data rate is 150 KB per second.

Since the printed journal is the archival copy, a representative frame from your movie or animation should be included in the manuscript as a figure. Include the file size and type of multimedia file in the figure caption.

Multimedia files should be submitted (preferably in compressed form) at the **same time** as the original article.

Supplementary data

Data files or extra figures can be submitted in any of the usual formats (PDF, Word, TeX, EPS, GIFF, TIFF, etc). We are also happy to consider output files from specialized data processing software and computer program codes. As we will not always be able to check the contents of data files, we request that the authors submit a 'read-me' file containing brief instructions on how to use the file, and a signed statement confirming that the material is as stated and is pertinent to the article. Supplementary data submitted as figures, TeX or Word will appear in the electronic journal in PDF format; specialized files will be offered in their original form.

PRINTED COLOUR ILLUSTRATIONS

The use of colour in diagrams can improve the presentation of results, and we are pleased to offer free colour in our Electronic Journals service available via the World Wide Web. However, because conventional colour printing is still an expensive process, we must ask you (or your institution) to pay the extra costs (over normal black-on-white reproduction) if you require colour in the printed version of your article. The costs are as follows:

- Full-colour illustrations: £475 for the first page plus £95 for each extra page.
- Single-colour (in addition to black) illustrations: £145 for the first page plus £30 for each extra page. **Please note that if this option is required, files must be set up as black and white with one additional defined Pantone colour (this should be specified to us). CMYK or RGB files are not acceptable; reproduction of these files will be charged as full-colour illustrations.**

If you would like your illustrations to be reproduced in colour in the printed version, please let us know who will be responsible for paying the additional costs.

If you do not want to pay for colour in the printed version and your colour illustrations will not show the correct information when reproduced in black and white please also supply a black-and-white version, which will reproduce correctly.

We prefer to receive illustrations as electronic files, but if you are supplying paper-only illustrations, glossy prints or original laser prints are better than colour photocopies. Instant camera prints (e.g. Polaroid prints) are not suitable. The size of the prints should be as close as possible to the final size expected in the journal (to avoid the need for large reductions/enlargements in printing). Copies of all illustrations should be supplied for the use of referees and for the guidance of the editorial staff and printer.

The most economical method of colour printing is to group several illustrations together; authors are warned that this may lead to some illustrations appearing out of numerical sequence and/or a greater than optimum distance from their text reference. However, despite this difficulty, the use of colour can enhance the display of many kinds of effect, and make possible the presentation of some kinds of data that could not be otherwise shown.

Authors who wish to use this facility of colour reproduction should sign the agreement form below and return it to Institute of Physics Publishing with their manuscript. (An invoice will be sent approximately one month after the article is published).
